EFFECTS OF DIFFERENT ROUTE OF ADMINISTRATION (NAMS)

Oral Estrogen

Beneficial effects

• Improves HDL-C, LDL-C, and total cholesterol

Negative effects

- Increases triglycerides, C-reactive protein, other hepatic proteins
- Increases the risk of thrombosis and stroke
- · Risk of reducing libido through SHBG effect

Transdermal Estrogen

Beneficial effects

- Less increase in triglycerides,
- Less effect on C-reactive protein,
- Less risk of thrombosis and stroke
- Less risk of reducing libido than oral E
