Government Assistance: Health Resources and Forms | Family Physicians & Nurse Practitioners

Persons with Disabilities (PWD)

Provincial

For people seeking financial assistancemany supplemental benefits available.

Person with Persistent Multiple Barriers (PPMB)

Provincial

For people who have long term barriers to employment and may not overcome in the short term.

Canada Pension Plan Disability (CPP-D)

Federal

For people who have made CPP contributions and unable to work due to disability.

Disability Tax Credit

Federal

Non-refundable tax credit for persons with prolonged and persistent disabilities.

PWD Eligibility

- 18 years old, with severe physical or mental impairment >2 years, significantly restricted in ADLs, require assistance with ADLs
- May work while on PWD <u>annual</u> total cannot exceed <u>exemption</u> <u>limit</u> or monthly rate will be affected
- Clients use My Self Serve or request an application in person at MSDPR or call: 1-866-866-0800

PPMB Eligibility

- Received income assistance for 12 months or over 15 consecutive months
- Medical condition is a barrier to employment for 1 yr. and likely to continue for at least 2 yrs.
- Clients use My Self Serve or request an application in person at MSDPR or call: 1-866-866-0800

CPP-D Eligibility

- Have a physical or mental impairment that is both severe and prolonged and prevents working at any job
- Under age 65
- Meet the minimum CPP contribution requirements
- The <u>application</u> for CPP disability benefits

Disability Tax Credit Eligibility

- One of the following: Blind, or markedly restricted in at least one of the basic activities of daily living, or significantly restricted in two or more or the basic activities of daily living, or needs life-sustaining therapy
- Link to application found here

PWD Benefits

- An <u>income assistance rate</u> based on situation and the size of family
- No-deductible PharmaCare
- May be eligible to access health supplements and programs, see pg 2

PPMB Benefits

- An exemption from having to work or look for work
- Premium-free MSP coverage and no-deductible PharmaCare
- May be eligible to access health supplements and programs, see pg 2
- Income Assistance Rates

CPP-D Benefits

- A monthly CPP disability pension that varies depending on how much and how long CPP contributions have been made
- Does not provide additional payments for prescription drugs, medical supplies, assistive devices or other health-related services

Disability Tax Credit Benefits

- Maximum disability amounts can be found here
- CRA may approve the DTC certificate indefinitely or for a shorter, specified period

Notes for Practitioners

- May receive benefits as a top up in addition to CPP-D, if the CPP-D falls below the provincial minimum.
- Persons who do not qualify may apply for PPMB

Notes for Practitioners

- May receive provincial PPMB benefits in addition to CPP-D in the form of a top-up, if the CPP-D benefits fall below the provincial minimum.

Notes for Practitioners

- If patient can still work on a regular basis, they will not likely qualify for CPP disability benefits
- CPP-D application should be attempted before provincial programs. If not eligible, proceed directly to PWD
- Billing information

Notes for Practitioners

- Impairment meets <u>all</u> of the following:
 - Be prolonged (the impairment has lasted, or is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months)
 - Be present substantially all the time (at least 90% of the time)
- Not billable to MSP
